### Tossed Onto Road

Tragedy struck a Vancouver family Monday night when two cars collided at Forty-ninth and Granville. One boy was killed and two children seriously hurt. Two other, including the father, are in hospital.

Dead is Bryan Garbe, 9, son of Louis Garbe, 39, of 2246 Newport Ave, who was in satisfactory condition in Vancouver General Hospital with head and hand injuries.

Mr. Garbe’s son, Wayne 8 is in satisfactory condition. The boy’s death was the 18<sup>th</sup> in Vancouver this year. (1958).

One vehicle was going east on 49<sup>th</sup> and the other south on Granville. The crash totally wrecked a 1958 station wagon carrying the Garbe family and inflicted heavy damage on the 1958 model U-drive car from Washington State.

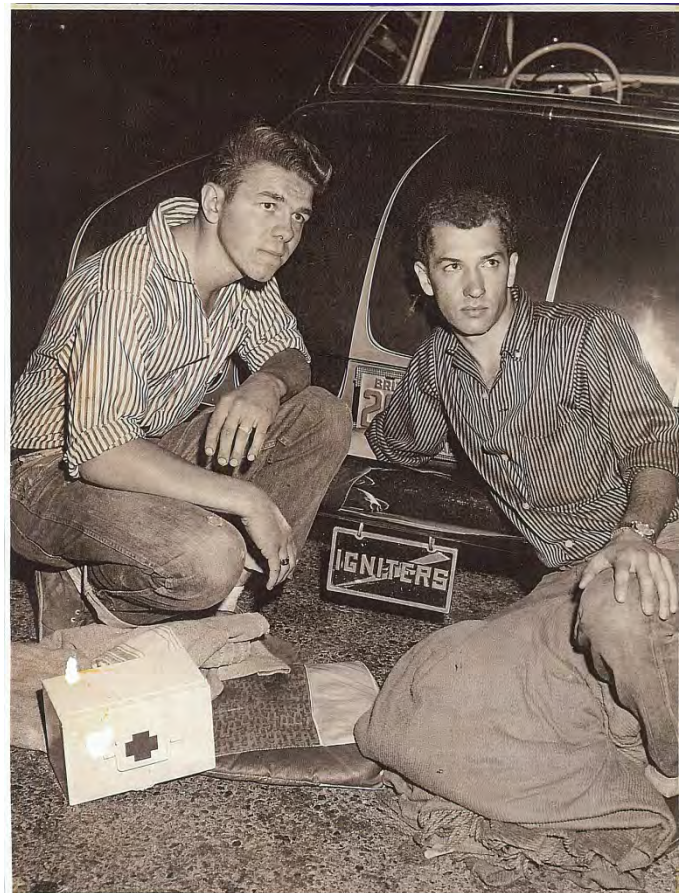
Witnesses at the scene said, one vehicle wound up wrapped around a gatepost at 6311 Granville, while the other swerved off the road and into a church yard.

Two occupants of the American vehicle escaped with minor injuries. Police said the occupants of the station wagon were thrown onto the pavement. The dead boy was lying on the curb while the other two seriously injured youngsters were tossed more than 40 feet by the impact.

**Investigating officers** praised two member of the ‘Ignitors Hot Rod Club’ Lyle Morrey, 2274 York and Ivan Moldowan, 6611 Marguerite, who gave First Aid to the injured and provided blankets and pillows.

Officers issued an appeal for a possible witness to the tragedy, who spoke to one of the drivers involved and said, “It is now 10:00 pm.” Police believe the man

may live in the area and ask that he contact the traffic division immediately.

The Hot Rod Café in Post Falls, Idaho closes after 14 years of offering great food at reasonable prices. Unfortunate as it is, the recession took its toll over the last 3 1/2 years and the owner could no longer continue. Lots of great events were held throughout the years at this classic eatery. For those who attended the GoodGuys Great Northwest Nationals held in Spokane, Washington each August, the Hot rod Café was the gathering place for the Thursday night Kick-off Party after the garage tours and cruise in the afternoon. The Thursday night Kick-off Party was a show in itself with the parking lot and surrounding area packed with hot rods, customs and muscle cars. The Hot Rod Cafe will be sorely missed.

**Calgary World of Wheels**

One of the first shows of the Canadian indoor season will be held February 17 – 19, 2012 at the BMO Round Up Center on the Calgary Stampede grounds with over \$26,000 in cash and awards. Many new rides are debuted with some special purpose built cars vying for the prestigious Jim Leslie Memorial Award and \$2000 cash. Car clubs are encouraged to enter up to 8 vehicles with a themed display in the 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Best Club Challenge to win almost \$2800 in prizes. New this year is a section called "Vintage Alley". The organizers of this ISCA show would like to incorporate a "Suede Palace" style section within the main show and are now looking for 20 period hot rods/customs to display in it. The" show

within a show” is intended to attract cars and people that maybe usually wouldn’t attend an event of this sort and to show the public what traditional/period hot rodding is all about. There will be specific vendors, along with music, such as pinstrippers, artists and tattooists, in the Vintage Alley section. The Calgary Diablos Car Club has been asked by the show organizers to host this part of the show. Trophies specific to this area will be included in the Sunday Awards presentation.
