GREETINGS for 2005 to the Membership of the NAAACCC Report # 33

The next seven years will determine the Federal structure of the collector vehicle hobby in Canada. According to the Federal Government, Bill C32 and Kyoto will be finalized by 2012. In your Province, there maybe Government discussions or proposed legislation that will eliminate the freedom to use your collector vehicles as you do now. In some cases, these discussions will lead to proposed legislation that will most certainly place a group of serious restrictions on your collector car hobby. If you are aware of these types of discussions, please contact your Provincial NAAACCC representative immediately so they may address these issues.

In 1996, we were able to fend off the inclusions in the proposed Canada Action Plan (CNAP) which would have seen Federal legislation remove all pre 1978 vehicles from our public highways. In British Columbia, some members of the Clean Air Advisory committee have recommended that all pre 1986 vehicles be taken off the public highways by the year 2008. If these discussions were left unchallenged I have no doubt that this proposed restrictive legislation would spread to many other Provinces. BC is often refered to as the California of the North. In 2003 , together with the SVA-Ontario and the CSRA, we were successful in modifying Bill 241/20. The list is endless as to what well-intentioned politicians and special interest groups would like to see implemented under the guise of “cleaning up the environment”
We continue to monitor Bill C -32 weekly.

The NAAACCC is comprised of a large number of individual clubs as well as several major organizations. We are linked with SEMA and the National Motorists Association in the United States and with the International Federation of Ancient Motor Vehicles in Europe (FIVA).

We are a non-profit Corporation that puts all of its resources back into the hobby so that you may all continue to enjoy and use your collector vehicles. All of our directors are volunteers and no one receives any payment for their efforts. We are a ‘Canadian’ organization formed over thirty years ago. We serve all of Canada equally.
